Golden State Series Races On Breeders' Cup Card

The pair of Golden State Series races for eligible Californiabreds, to be run on the Friday, Nov. 1 Breeders' Cup card at Santa Anita Park, drew 16 nominations each.

The \$200,000 Golden State Juvenile for two-year-old colts at a mile drew five stakes winners, including Tamarando, winner of the grade I, \$300,000 Del Mar Futurity.

The \$200,000 Golden State Juvenile Fillies for two-year-old fillies at a mile drew five stakes-placed runners.

The purse structure for the races pays \$110,000 to the winner down to \$4,000 for eighth place.

Eight Cal-Breds Pre-Entered In Breeders' Cup



Eight California-breds were pre-entered on Wednesday for the 2013 Breeders' Cup, which will be held at Santa Anita Park on November 1-2.

Aotearoa was pre-entered in the grade I, \$1 million Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf. Aotearoa is by Magali Farms' Good Journey, out of the Lil Tyler mare Madera Royal, was bred by owner Paul Viskovich and trained by Leonard Powell. He has two wins in three starts, earnings of \$114,000 and is coming off a win in the October 6 Zuma Beach Stakes.

Tiz Flirtatious was pre-entered in the grade I, \$2 million Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf. Tiz Flirtatious is by Harris Farms' Tizbud, out of the Victory Gallop mare Masquerade Belle, was bred by owner Pamela Ziebarth and is trained by Martin Jones. She has eight wins in 12 starts, earnings of \$774,800 and is coming off a win in the September 28 Rodeo Drive Stakes.

Ismene and Teddy's Promise were pre-entered in the grade I, \$1 million Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint. Ismene is by Ballena Vista Farm's Tribal Rule, out of the In Excess (Ire) mare Never to

Cal Cup, Sunshine Millions To Combine In 2014





January 25, 2014, said Doug Burge, Executive Director of the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association (CTBA).

"Part of the reason is that we felt we needed to get Cal Cup out of the fall," Burge said. "If you look at the results (handle and attendance) in recent years, Cal Cup has struggled, and it has really struggled in years in which Santa Anita is hosting the Breeders' Cup."

California-breds, through the CTBA's Golden State Series, will be on display during the Breeder's Cup World Championships November 1, with a pair of stakes on the undercard, the Golden State Juvenile and Golden State Juvenile Fillies. Each is worth \$200,000 and will be contested at one mile.

"It's going to be great exposure for us and great for the Breeders' Cup," Burge said. "They will be full fields and good betting races."

The Sunshine Millions/California Cup Day in 2014, will consist of seven state-bred stakes worth nearly \$1.2 million, as well as a couple of graded stakes. The Cal Cup Classic purse was boosted \$75,000 and will be worth \$250,000. It will be

contested on dirt at 1 1/8 miles. The prior juvenile stakes for two-year-olds will now be the Cal Cup Derby and Cal Cup Oaks, each worth \$250,000 at 1 1/16 miles, Burge said.

The other races are the \$125,000 Cal Cup Distaff on the hill-side turf course at about 6 1/2 furlongs, the \$100,000 Cal Cup Sprint at six furlongs, the \$100,000 Crystal Water for older horses at one mile on turf, and the \$100,000 Valentine Dancer for older fillies and mares also at one mile on turf.

"We see this as a way to revitalize it," Burge said of California Cup.

The Sunshine Millions, originally designed as a competition between horses bred in Florida and California, changed in nature over the past couple of years, with the two states competing on separate days in races limited to their own. Last year, Santa Anita held four Cal-bred races, including the Crystal Water and Valentine Dancer, as well as the \$250,000 Santa Monica (grade II) and the \$100,000 Santa Ysabel (grade III) stakes.

To enhance the information available to prospective owners of Thoroughbred racehorses, Owner-View today announced a new service called "OwnerView Host." The free service will provide a further source of basic information for people interested in owning Thoroughbred racehorses, covering topics such as business plans, ownership options, licensing, costs and expenses, and "There is a lot of information available to prospective owners before they hire a trainer or make that first horse purchase, and OwnerView hosts will help them digest many of the basics of owning Thoroughbred racehorses," said Gary Falter, project manager for OwnerView. "We won't offer specifics on the selection of agents, trainers, and horses, but we will explain where to go, how to make contacts, and what to do to become a Thoroughbred owner."

Anyone interested in using the OwnerView Host service can fill out a form at ownerview.com available through the link, "Contact us to discuss your plans."

"When we receive a request, we will reply to the prospective owner to setup an initial discussion," Falter said. "After the introductory contact, prospective owners will have the opportunity to speak to an OwnerView host who can walk them through ownership topics at OwnerView.com and answer questions."

OwnerView was launched by The Jockey Club Information Systems Inc. and the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association (TOBA) in May 2012, in the wake of McKinsey & Company's economic study of the sport that recommended a central resource that would encourage Thoroughbred ownership and provide accurate information about purchasing and owning a Thoroughbred. CTBA Directors Election Deadline Reminder

Those members of the California Thorough-bred Breeders Association (CTBA) who wish to seek election to the group's Board of Directors through the petition process are reminded that they have until November 10, 2013, 90 days prior to the CTBA's Annual Meeting and Awards Dinner to submit their completed application. As per the association's bylaws, it needs to include a minimum of 25 signatures from current CTBA members for the applicant to be included on the ballot for this year's election which relates to the three-year term as a director form 2014 to 2016.

New Mares Bred Report Accessibility

The Jockey Club Information Systems (TJCIS) today unveiled a new Equineline product that provides access to detailed Report of Mares Bred information on stallions that bred mares in North America. Customers can order reports on individual stallions by breeding year, commencing with 2013, or buy a subscription that provides unlimited access to all stallions for the 2013 breeding year.

"Detailed Report of Mares Bred information has never before been offered for North American stallions," said Carl Hamilton, chairman and president of TJCIS. "It is a valuable tool for stallion managers and an efficient research tool for anyone making breeding decisions by providing the most current breeding information available."

For each stallion in a selected breeding year, the report includes the name of each mare bred with the year of birth, the sire, and last reported live foal including foaling date, sex, sire, breeder, and state in which the foal was bred. If a mare has not produced a foal, the report includes the name of the mare's owner when she last raced.

These reports also provide the sire's pedigree, location, inbreeding dosage, tabulated race record, and lifetime statistical summaries for its progeny.

Tax Tips For Yearling Buyers

For those attending the yearling sales, it is worth looking at the tax incentives that are available to a purchaser of a yearling this year. There are three incentive provisions which can apply: 1) the Expense Provision which allows the purchaser to expense (write-off) all or a portion



of the purchase price of a horse, including yearlings; 2) Bonus Depreciation, which allows the purchaser to write-off 50 percent of the purchase price of a yearling; and 3) Three-year Depreciation on the purchase of any race-horse, including yearlings. One or even all three of these provisions can apply to a single purchase provided the horse qualifies and is placed in service in 2013. The discussion which follows is a summary of the three provisions intended to point out the potential tax benefits that might be available to a purchaser. Since, like most tax provisions, they have technicalities which must be met, a purchaser who wants to use one or more of the provisions should consult with their tax advisor to make sure the provision(s) applies to their situation.

Expense Deduction

1)A purchaser can deduct up to \$500,000 of the cost of a horse or horses purchased in 2013, provided (1) the total of all purchases of horses and other depreciable business property does not exceed \$2 million and (2) the horse is placed in service by the purchaser in 2013. If the purchase exceeds \$2 million, the amount that can be expensed in 2013 is reduced one dollar for each dollar the amount of such purchases exceeds \$2 million. To

illustrate, assume a person purchases two yearlings at the sale, one for \$300,000, and one for \$250,000, and made no other purchases of horses or other business property during 2013. The purchaser can expense \$500,000 of the cost. The remaining \$50,000 can be depreciated using one

or both of the depreciation methods explained below. Note that the expense provision applies to purchases of horses of all ages and to other types of business property new or used such as tractors and other farm equipment. Also note that purchases of property used in any business of the purchaser, not just the horse business, is included in the \$2 million threshold. One other restriction—the expense deduction can only be used against the aggregate taxable income derived by the purchaser from a business, any business, including compensation earned as an employee.

Bonus Depreciation

2)This provision allows the purchaser of certain horses in 2013 to depreciate 50 percent of the cost if the horse is placed in service that year. To qualify, the original use of the horse must commence with the purchaser whether or not such use corresponds to the use of the purchaser. This means that yearlings at the sale most likely can qualify, but older horses likely will not. It has been industry practice for many years to treat young racehorses as placed in service when conditioning and training first begins. Thus, under this practice, a year-

ling would be placed in service when conditioning and training begins. There is no limit on the total dollar amount that can qualify for bonus deprecation provided the yearling(s) are "placed in service" in 2013.

For example, if a purchaser buys and places in service ten yearlings in 2013 for a total cost of \$2 million and that was the only purchase of depreciable business property that year, the purchaser could, using the expense provision, deduct \$500,000 and take bonus depreciation of \$750,000 (50 percent times\$1.5 million). The \$750,000 balance of the cost would be deducted over a three year period using the regular depreciation rules explained in the next section.

Three-year Depreciation

3)All racehorses purchased and placed in service in 2013 can be depreciated over a three year period (four calendar years), using an accelerated rate. This means a deduction of 25 percent of the purchase price of a yearling, if neither the expense deduction, nor bonus depreciation is taken, and 50 percent of the remaining

balance of the purchase price in 2014. In other words, 62.5 percent of the purchase price of the yearling can be written off in the first two years. If the expense deduction, bonus depreciation, or both are taken, 25 percent of the remaining balance after the other deduction(s) are taken can also be deducted in 2013 and 50 percent of the balance in 2014.

It is noteworthy that all three of the incentives discussed above are scheduled to change next year unless Congress acts to extend or change them. The expense deduction is scheduled to go down to \$25,000 next year, bonus depreciation is scheduled to expire altogether, and three-year depreciation for young race horses not over two years old when placed in service is scheduled to go back to seven years. At this point, particularly because of the discussions going on in Congress about reforming the tax code, it is hard to predict when and what Congress might do with respect to these three incentive provisions.



California-Bred Flashback: MacArthur Park

Macarthur Park was the sixth of 11 foals out of the Conjure mare Betty's Fortune, who also produced stakes winners Lucky Mike and Fortunate Betty. The Norfolk was Macarthur Park's eighth win in 13 starts. He won six other stakes, including the Del Mar Futurity, and finished his career with nine wins in 14 starts and earnings of \$214,415. Macarthur Park, a \$20,000 Del Mar Yearling Sale purchase, was bred by Old English Rancho and owned by Mark Three Stable.


