He has five wins in 14 starts, earnings of \$332,330 and is coming off a second in the October 5 City of Hope Mile.





California Chrome, who rallied late to finish sixth, beaten just two lengths in the seven furlong Del Mar Futurity, is trained by Art Sherman and will try a route of ground for the first time.

A chestnut son of Harris Farms' hot sire Lucky Pulpit, California Chrome was an easy winner of the \$100,000 Graduation Stakes versus statebreds two starts back on July 31.

Owned by his breeders, Steven Coburn and Martin Perry, California Chrome has \$100,850 in earnings from a record of 5-2-1-0.

Hollendorfer will also send out the undefeated Life Is a Joy, a two-year-old gelding by Victory Rose Thoroughbreds' Globalize who comes

off a six-length win in the one mile Charlie Palmer Futurity at The Big Fresno Fair. Off at 7-2, Life Is a Joy won gate to wire in 1:36.88, and earned a Beyer Speed figure of 73.

Owned and bred by Hollendorfer, his wife, Janet, and George Todaro, Life Is a Joy has earnings of \$85,330 and he'll be ridden for the first time by eastern-based Joel Rosario.

#### Stabling Agreement Made Available

At the October 24 meeting of the California Horse Racing Board (CHRB), a discussion took place concerning an agreement entered into among the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club, Santa Anita Park, Los Alamitos Race Course and the Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC) addressing issues relating to: (1) where Thoroughbreds will be stabled in Southern California in 2014 and 2015; (2) how funds will be allocated to pay for such stabling, and (3) the parties' view of how they would apply to the CHRB for racing dates.

Because the agreement contains information about the parties' respective financial commitments, the parties provided it to the CHRB on a confidential basis in anticipation of the October 24 meeting.

In view of the discussion at the meeting, the parties have decided that it is in the best interests of the racing industry to release the agreement publicly, and have requested that the CHRB post it on its website. The agreement can be found under the Publications link on the CHRB Website (<a href="https://www.chrb.ca.gov">www.chrb.ca.gov</a>).

#### **NorCal Fair Issue Delayed a Month**

State racing officials will take at least another month to decide whether to give the state fair an extra week of horse racing next year at the expense of the Sonoma County Fair.

The California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) had been scheduled to vote on the plan Thursday in a meeting in Santa Anita, but it became evident there was deep disagreement between key parts of the horse racing industry and board member Steve Beneto, who proposed the change last month.

Chairman David Israel delayed the vote until at least the November 21 meeting, calling for more negotiations in the meantime.

Beneto, a former member of the state fair board, wants Sonoma County to move its fair a week later to accommodate an extra week of racing at the state fair, set to wrap up July 27.—continued at <a href="http://www.bressdemocrat.com">http://www.bressdemocrat.com</a>, By Sean Scully

#### **Prepare for Breeding Stock Sales**


For those attending the 2013 breeding stock sales, it is worth looking at a tax incentive that may apply to purchases this year. The Expense Provision allows the purchaser to expense (write-off) all or a portion of the purchase price of a horse or horses, including broodmare prospects. This incentive can apply to a single purchase provided the horse qualifies and is placed in service in 2013. Since, like most tax provisions, there are technicalities which must be met, a purchaser who wants to use this provision should consult with their tax advisor to make sure it applies to their situation. Below are some details.

A purchaser can deduct up to \$500,000 of the cost of a horse or horses purchased in 2013, provided (1) the total of all purchases of horses and other depreciable business property does not exceed \$2 million and (2) the horse is placed in service by the purchaser in 2013. If the purchase exceeds \$2 million, the amount that can be expensed in 2013 is reduced one dollar for each dollar the amount of such purchases exceeds \$2 million.

#### **Tax Tips For Yearling Buyers**


For those attending the yearling sales, it is worth looking at the tax incentives that are available to a purchaser of a yearling this year. There are three incentive provisions which can apply: 1) the Expense Provision which allows the purchaser to expense (write-off) all or a portion



horse, including yearlings. One or even all three of these provisions can apply to a single purchase provided the horse qualifies and is placed in service in 2013. The discussion which follows is a summary of the three provisions intended to point out the potential tax benefits that might be available to a purchaser. Since, like most tax provisions, they have technicalities which must be met, a purchaser who wants to use one or more of the provisions should consult with their tax advisor to make sure the provision(s) applies to their situation.

#### **Expense Deduction**

1)A purchaser can deduct up to \$500,000 of the cost of a horse or horses purchased in 2013, provided (1) the total of all purchases of horses and other depreciable business property does not exceed \$2 million and (2) the horse is placed in service by the purchaser in 2013. If the purchase exceeds \$2 million, the amount that can be expensed in 2013 is reduced one dollar for each dollar the amount of such purchases exceeds \$2 million. To



or both of the depreciation methods explained below. Note that the expense provision applies to purchases of horses of all ages and to other types of business property new or used such as tractors and other farm equipment. Also note that purchases of property used in any business of the purchaser, not just the horse business, is included in the \$2 million threshold. One other restriction—the expense deduction can only be used against the aggregate taxable income derived by the purchaser from a business, any business, including compensation earned as an employee.

#### **Bonus Depreciation**

2)This provision allows the purchaser of certain horses in 2013 to depreciate 50 percent of the cost if the horse is placed in service that year. To qualify, the original use of the horse must commence with the purchaser whether or not such use corresponds to the use of the purchaser. This means that yearlings at the sale most likely can qualify, but older horses likely will not. It has been industry practice for many years to treat young racehorses as placed in service when conditioning and training first begins. Thus, under this practice, a year-

ling would be placed in service when conditioning and training begins. There is no limit on the total dollar amount that can qualify for bonus deprecation provided the yearling(s) are "placed in service" in 2013.

For example, if a purchaser buys and places in service ten yearlings in 2013 for a total cost of \$2 million and that was the only purchase of depreciable business property that year, the purchaser could, using the expense provision, deduct \$500,000 and take bonus depreciation of \$750,000 (50 percent times\$1.5 million). The \$750,000 balance of the cost would be deducted over a three year period using the regular depreciation rules explained in the next section.

#### Three-year Depreciation

3)All racehorses purchased and placed in service in 2013 can be depreciated over a three year period (four calendar years), using an accelerated rate. This means a deduction of 25 percent of the purchase price of a yearling, if neither the expense deduction, nor bonus depreciation is taken, and 50 percent of the remaining

balance of the purchase price in 2014. In other words, 62.5 percent of the purchase price of the yearling can be written off in the first two years. If the expense deduction, bonus depreciation, or both are taken, 25 percent of the remaining balance after the other deduction(s) are taken can also be deducted in 2013 and 50 percent of the balance in 2014.

It is noteworthy that all three of the incentives discussed above are scheduled to change next year unless Congress acts to extend or change them. The expense deduction is scheduled to go down to \$25,000 next year, bonus depreciation is scheduled to expire altogether, and three-year depreciation for young race horses not over two years old when placed in service is scheduled to go back to seven years. At this point, particularly because of the discussions going on in Congress about reforming the tax code, it is hard to predict when and what Congress might do with respect to these three incentive provisions.




