Unusual Heat Records Six-Peat

Unusual Heat (Nureyev-Rossard (Den)) once again defended his California Leading Sire Championship in 2013 doing so for the sixth consecutive year with earnings of \$4,903,019. The "Six-Peat" is the first in the modern era of California and the rare feat has only been matched and surpassed in the past by the amazing Khaled (1952-1964). Unusual Heat now boasts career progeny earnings of over \$41.8 million.

Unusual Heat's 2013 earnings of \$4,903,019 are the fifth highest total in California history for a single year giving Unusual Heat three of the top five California sire seasons ever and six of the top nine seasons. Unusual Heat set the all-time California earnings record in 2008 with progeny earnings of \$5,827,513 and is one of only two California sires to ever go over the \$5 million mark in earnings for a single season, doing it twice (2008 and 2009).

The 2013 season also marked Unusual Heat's astonishing and unprecedented 10th consecutive California Turf Earnings Championship (2004-2013) with progeny earnings of \$3,390,407. Unusual Heat is the all-time leader in California sire turf earnings with a career total of \$23,919,417.

In 2013, Unusual Heat was led by grade II and multiple stakes-winning colt Gervinho, leading earning and multiple stakes-winning filly Unusual Way, grade II-placed warrior Huntsville, Breeders' Cup Mile participant He Be Fire N Ice and black-type stakes winners Surfcup, U'narack and Unusual Hottie.

Unusual Heat, 24, will stand in 2014 at Harris Farms in Coalinga, California. His stud fee is \$20,000 to approved mares only.

Three-Peat For Tribal Rule

Tribal Rule led California sires by two-year-old progeny earnings in 2013 for the third consecutive year and was a clear leader on the state's general sire list by winners (107) and races won (199), according to statistics compiled by *the Blood-Horse*.

Tribal Rule also had progeny earnings of \$4,810,599, second overall to Unusual Heat (\$4,903,019).

The versatile son of Storm Cat gets runners on all surfaces. Second among California sires by turf earnings last year (\$1,417,106), Tribal Rule was the leading California sire by all-weather earnings

(\$1,771,082) and fourth nationally behind Kentucky sires Candy Ride (Arg), Stormy Atlantic and Canadian sire Niigon.

Ironically, Candy Ride's rise to the top on the all-weather sire list was enabled by the Hollywood Futurity grade I victory of Shared Belief, the second graded winner produced by Tribal Rule's full sister Common Hope.

Tribal Rule has lifetime progeny earnings of \$19.6 million with eight crops to the races. His 2014 stud fee is \$6,500 and he stands at Ballena Vista Farm as the property of Ballena Vista Farm and River Edge Operating LLC.

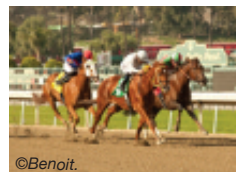
Eldwin Burch Memorial Service Friday

Cyclometer Peddles Fast To Win

California-bred Cyclometer overcame a slow break for a game win in Saturday's \$88,960 Midnight Lute Stakes at Santa Anita Park.

Cyclometer is by Old English Rancho's Cyclotron, out of the Eastern Echo mare Moana Loa, was bred by owners Bruce Headley and Irwin and Andrew Molasky and is trained by Headley.

"It was a little eventful leaving the gate, to be honest," said jockey Mike Smith. "A horse acted up and my horse rocked back a bit so we spotted everyone a jump at the start. I still got away in good order...so I was just hoping I was two jumps better than (pace-setting) Anillo because I had already given him one."

"Cyclometer was really on his game today. In the stretch, I could only mess it up, at that point. I just kept hand-riding him, and it was working."

Cyclometer has five wins in 17 starts, earnings of \$330,254 and was coming off a second in the November 24 On Trust.

Cyclometer ran the six furlongs in 1:08.95 and won by three-quarters of a length at odds of 3-2 in the field of four.

Unusual Heat 4th Leading Turf Sire

California stallion Unusual Heat finished fourth in the nation for 2013 progeny turf earnings, according to *Daily Racing Form*.

Led by grade II winner Gervinho's \$290,140 in purses, progeny by Unusual Heat totaled \$3,390,407 in turf earnings, trailing only Kentucky stallions Kitten's Joy, Giant's Causeway and Stormy Atlantic.

Ranking 10th, 11th and 15th on the list, respectively, were prominent Kentucky stallions Medaglia d'Oro, Smart Strike and Tapit.

Unusual Heat stands at Harris Farms and his stud fee is \$20,000 to approved mares only.



Auerbach, Derek Get CHRB Posts

Madeline Auerbach has been appointed, and Bo Derek has been re-appointed, to the California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) by Gov. Jerry Brown, it was announced on Thursday.

Auerbach, 69, of Bell Canyon, has been a horse owner and breeder at M. Auerbach LLC since 2000, during which she has been most known as a primary owner of top stallion Unusual Heat. She was a chief financial officer at JSA Corporation dba Hippopotamus from 1977 to 2004. Auerbach is a director of Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC) and the founder and chair of the California Retirement Management Account (CARMA).

Derek, 57, of Santa Ynez, has served on the CHRB since 2008. Derek has been the owner of Bless the Beasts since 1998 and has been a film and television actress since 1977.



Paul Bernhard Jr. Passes at 82

Paul Bernhard Jr., a longtime member of the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association (CTBA) and horse owner, died on December 12 from complications from various infections at the age of 82. Paul raced under the name P & M Stables.

Bernhard was an active participant each year in the CTBA/California Cup celebration and he was associated with Red Star Fertilizer Company for 60 years, serving as President and General Manager for 43 years, a position he held at the time of his death.

He is survived by his wife Mary and two stepsons, Kirk and Keith Pierce.

He won at first asking, running the six furlongs in 1:09.87 and winning by two lengths at odds of 24-1.

California-Bred Flashback: Kfar Tov

Kfar Tov, a son of New Policy, won the \$40,000 Malibu Stakes for four-year-olds at Santa Anita Park, with Autobiography second and Diplomatic Agent third in a field of seven. Kfar Tov was trained by John Pappalardo and ridden by Jerry Lambert. He ran the seven furlongs in 1:21 on a fast track and won by a nose at odds of 4-1. Kfar Tov was the fifth of eight foals out of the Mr. Busher mare Lotus Bush. The Malibu was Kfar Tov's sixth win in 11 starts.
