\$125,000 Donald Valpredo California Cup Sprint

Proven Cyclometer In Cal Cup Sprint

Veteran conditioner Bruce Headley will be represented by six-year-old horse and likely favorite Cyclometer in Saturday's \$125,000 Donald Valpredo California Cup Sprint for older horses at six furlongs, a race that attracted a field of 10 older horses.

An important component to the Golden State Series for horses bred or sired in California, the Donald Valpredo California Cup Sprint is part of a newly created Sunshine Millions California Cup Day at Santa Anita Park that will offer fans six stakes and 10 races overall.

Fresh off victory in the six furlong Midnight Lute Stakes January 4, Cyclometer would appear to be at the top of his game for Headley, who has specialized in taking his time with older horses throughout a storybook training career in the Golden State.

Owned and bred by Headley and Irwin and Andrew Molasky, Cyclometer was a close second as the 8-5 favorite two starts back in the 7 1/2 furlongs On Trust Handicap November 24, and was a 2 ¼ length allowance winner going 6 1/2 furlongs three back on November 7.

By the Grand Slam stallion Old English Rancho's Cyclotron, Cyclometer has two wins and three seconds at six furlongs and is 8-3-3-1 at The Great Race Place. He has earnings of \$330,254 from an overall mark of 17-5-5-3 and will be ridden back by Mike Smith.

With a hefty bankroll of \$526,395 to his credit, veteran Luckarack is easily the highest money-earner in the Sprint field. Reclaimed by trainer Ed Moger Jr. out of a gutsy \$40,000 claiming win going 6 1/2 furlongs down the hillside turf course December 26, the six-year-old Lucky Pulpit gelding will be making his 41st career start Saturday and be ridden back by Martin Pedroza.

With seven wins from 16 tries on natural dirt, Luckarack should be undaunted by the surface switch and is well suited at the distance as well, evidenced by his four wins, two seconds and four thirds from 12 starts at six furlongs.

Owned by Steve Moger, Luckarack has an impressive overall mark of 40-13-6-6.

Trainer Mark Glatt will be represented by the rapidly improving Follini, who was a galloping 3 1/4 length allowance winner going six furlongs on November 30, and who came back to make the lead and run a big third in a second condition allowance going 6 1/4 furlongs January 3—achieving a career-best 94 Beyer Speed figure.

A four-year-old colt by Western Fame, Follini figures to be sent from the rail by regular rider Joe Talamo. Owned by Glatt, William Branch and Cory Wagner, Follini has three wins, a second and two thirds from nine starts.

William Ziering's homebred Kate's Event, a 7-year-old horse by Event of the Year, was a winner of the 7 1/2 furlong Tiznow Stakes versus statebreds April 27, and has been idle since well beaten in the 6 1/2 furlong Governor's Cup Handicap at Fairplex Park September 18.

Trained by Jerry Hollendorfer, Kate's Event has a win and a second from two starts going six furlongs and has run well at Santa Anita, posting a 9-4-2-1 mark in Arcadia.

Kate's Event has an overall record of 19-6-2-1 and will be ridden for the first time by Victor Espinoza on Saturday. He has earnings of \$329,406.

Del Mar Announces 2014 Schedule



With all approvals ensured and long-range projections starting to come into clear focus, the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club has begun to move forward toward a two-meet racing season in 2014—the initial session being its usual summer stand, the second a shorter run covering the month of November.

Near the conclusion of 2013, Del Mar received the green light for its dual meets from both the California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) and the California Coastal Commission. In addition, it also worked through date and grounds issues with its landlord—the 22nd District Agricultural Association, the state body that oversees the multi-purpose, 350-acre Del Mar Fairgrounds that is home to the seaside racing oval.

With all parties in agreement, Del Mar officials now are preparing to put on their usual special summer show followed by a unique fall session that will help patch one of the holes in the Southern California racing calendar caused by the closing of Betfair Hollywood Park in December.

The track's summer season—which will be its 75th going back to 1937—will open on Thursday, July 17 and go forward to Wednesday, September 3. Over the past several decades, Del Mar usually has started its regular meet on a Wednesday, but with the San Diego County Fair running until Sunday, July 6 in 2014, the extra day to prepare the grounds and the racing surface—and to allow horses to adapt to it—was considered a safety priority. Del Mar last opened on a Thursday in 1999, and also opened on that day in 1969 and 1956.

Del Mar's fall meeting will have 15 racing days, opening on Friday, November 7 and concluding on Sunday, November 30. It will race Friday-Saturday-Sunday on its first weekend, then settle into a four-days-per-week (Thursday through Sunday) schedule for the balance of the session. In conjunction with the singular nature of the second season, track officials are planning a totally different theme to the session, one that calls on the track's Hollywood roots harkening back to its founder, Bing Crosby, and his show business connections.

First post during the summer will be the usual 2 p.m. with the adjustment to 4 p.m. for all "Four O'Clock Friday" cards. The fall stand, however, will see first post at 12 noon throughout to allow for the earlier sunsets. The lone exception to the noon start will be Thanksgiving Day, November 27, when the starting time will be 11 a.m. to allow fans time for a day at the races as well as the opportunity to be home in time for a turkey dinner.

Both sessions this year will showcase the debut of Del Mar's new seven-furlong inner turf course, a wider, safer racing surface that is replacing the track's original greensward installed in 1960.

Online ticket and seat sales for the summer meet is schedule to start on Friday, May 9 at 10 a.m. Tickets and seats will be available for the fall session during the summer meeting beginning on a date yet to be determined.

In 2015, Del Mar is scheduled to run a similar twofold arrangement with slightly different dates. The 2015 summer season is slated for Wednesday, July 15 through Labor Day Monday, September 7, an expansion of its standard dates from seven to eight weekends and a total of 41 racing days. The fall session would be scheduled from Wednesday, October 28 through Wednesday, December 2, a five-week season that would enable the track to be open and available during the Breeders' Cup traditional dates, which are normally either the last weekend in October or the first in November.

"Our fall race meeting starting this year will be totally separate from our summer session," noted Del Mar's President and CEO, Joe Harper. "They will be two different animals. We know our summer meet is a winner; we've proven it over and over again. And we expect our autumn run can be special, too, in its own way. With the backing of our horsemen and all our many racing fans in the San Diego area, we think we can put on a first-rate show here in the fall and help to keep racing in Southern California strong and successful."

Weekly Update

CHRB Meeting Summary

The California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) conducted its regular meeting Thursday, January 16, 2014, at Santa Anita Park. Chairman Chuck Winner presided. 1st Vice Chair Bo Derek, 2nd Vice Chair Richard Rosenberg, and Commissioners Madeline Auerbach, Steve Beneto, Jesse Choper, and George Krikorian were in attendance.



The audio of this entire Board meeting is available on the CHRB Website (www.chrb.ca.gov) under the webcast link. In brief:

- Chairman Winner began the public meeting with the announcement that in closed session, the board had met to consider personnel matters, as authorized by Government Code 11126 (A), and during that closed session the board approved motions: "One, to make a conditional employment offer to Frederick M. "Rick" Baedeker to be the board's Executive Director with the offer being conditioned on Mr. Baedeker's successful completion of the state's hiring process, and two, to delegate full authority to myself, as chair, to take any and all steps necessary to finalize Baedeker's appointment as executive director without further action by the board following Baedeker's successful completion of the state's hiring process. That vote was unanimous, and we will welcome, in the near term, Rick Baedeker as our new executive director."
- Chairman Winner welcomed newly appointed Commissioner Madeline Auerbach to her first meeting as a member of the board.
- The board approved a regulatory amendment directing that a claim shall not be voided by the stewards if prior to the race the claimant elects to claim the horse regardless of whether the racing or official veterinarian determines the horse will be placed on the Veterinarian's List as unsound or lame.
- Representatives of the California Marketing Committee (CMC) reported on their \$1.75 million budget for 2014. Chairman Winner indicated that several matters discussed during this report will be referred to two committees of the board for further discussion.
- Representatives of quarter horse racing at Los Alamitos and harness racing at Cal Expo reported they have signed an agreement that settles issues pertaining to the distribution of Advance Deposit Wagering (ADW) revenue.
- 1st Vice Chair Derek, who chairs the Medication and Track Safety Committee, reported on the committee's Wednesday meeting and announced that the Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC) has offered to spend \$150,000 to improve security in stable areas. She said she will be appointing a special committee to review security issues and help determine how the money should be spent.
- Consideration of the 2015 allocation of dates for Northern California was rescheduled for the February 21 meeting of the board.

Baedeker Named To CHRB Post

Rick Baedeker, the former president of Hollywood Park, has been named executive director of the California Horse Racing Board (CHRB), the regulatory board announced Thursday.

The racing board met in a private executive session before its scheduled meeting on Thursday to approve Baedeker's appointment unanimously, according to chairman Chuck Winner. The position has been vacant since last summer, following the death of Kirk Breed from an illness.

The appointment is contingent upon Baedeker completing the state's formal hiring process, according to a statement read at the start of the meeting by Winner.

Baedeker, 64, oversaw Hollywood Park from 1999 to 2005 when the track was owned by Churchill Downs Inc. In recent years, Baedeker has worked as a consultant for the Breeders' Cup in California and has helped in the development of mini-satellites in Southern California at restaurants and bars.

In the 1990s, he worked as a marketing executive at Hollywood Park and the National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA), and held leadership positions at The Woodlands racetrack in Kansas City, Kansas, and with Television Games Network (TVG) during its early development.
