Injury kept Weewinnin off the track for 11 months in 2013. After that long of a layoff, a few seconds of suspense was not an issue for his backers in Saturday's \$251,500 California

"We had a great trip," Talamo said. "I was able to sit behind the two horses in front. I could see that (Summer Hit) was starring to get tired, and I was able to get through.

Cup Turf Classic at Santa Anita Park.

Jockey Joe Talamo had Weewinnin on the rail on the turn of the turf race over 1 1/8 miles, waiting for running room behind the pacesetters. When space developed, Talamo urged Weewinnin to the front in early stretch and guided the four-year-old gelding to a 21-1 upset win in the year's top race for older California-breds.

Weewinnin (\$44.80) finished 2 1/4 lengths in front of 10-1 Stoney Fleece, who was a neck in front of 9-2 Jules Journey. Summer Hit, the 6-5 favorite, set a quick pace of :23.45 and :46.88 seconds but faded from contention in the final furlong.

Weewinnin was fourth for the first six furlongs, racing on the inside.

"I had a ton of horse," Talamo said. "For a mile and an eighth race, they went a fast pace. My horse loved the distance."

Huntsville finished fourth, but was only a neck behind Stoney Fleece. Lucky Primo, the winner of the 2012 California Cup Classic, finished fifth, followed by China Prince, Empty Headed, Maybe Tuesday, Summer Hit, Jonny's Choice, Unusual

Meeting, Hittheroadrunning, Tiz a Minister, and Affrettando.

Weewinnin races for E-Racing.com, Bill and Jill Gray, Janet Lyons and Jeremy Peskoff. By Grav's Farm's Comic Strip, Weewinnin has won three of sixstarts and \$281,880.



Weewinnin was the 60-1 upset winner of the King Glorious Stakes at Beffair Hollywood Park in December of 2012. Weewinnin was eighth in the California Breeders' Champion Stakes open division here in January 2013 before being sidelined.

Trained by Brian Koriner, Weewinnin returned to racing at Hollywood Park in December, finishing second in an allowance race over six furlongs on turf. "He ran great last time," Talamo said. \$250,000 California Cup Derby

California Chrome proved himself best of the statebreds on Saturday at Santa Anita Park with an overpowering victory in the \$250,000 California Cup Derby, a performance that his trainer, Art Sherman, thought was in him, and which will earn California Chrome a shot to prove himself worth of getting to another Derby, the one in Kentucky on May 3.

"He had been training like a bomb," Sherman said after California Chrome rolled to a 5 1/2-length victory in the 1 1/16-mile race for three-year-olds. Tamarando, winner of the grade I Del Mar Futurity last summer, rallied for second, 3 1/4 lengths in front of third-placed Life Is a Joy.

Awesome Return was fourth and was followed, in order, by Better Bet, Public Policy and Lucky Views.

Three horses did not finish the race. Aotearoa was eased on the far turn. And then in the stretch, Electric Eddie, while racing in fifth place, broke down, and, unable to run straight because of his injuries, veered into the path of Oh Billy Billy, who ran into him.

Martin Garcia, riding Oh Billy Billy, and Mario Gutierrez, on Electric Eddie, both were dislodged. Neither rider appeared injured, nor did Oh Billy Billy.

Electric Eddie, however, suffered a serious injury to his left front leg. He was taken back to the barn of trainer Ben Cecil for X-rays. As of 5:30 p.m. Pacific on Saturday, he was still alive.

California Chrome was winning for the fourth time in eight starts. This was the second straight race in which he clobbered his opposition. He won the sevenfurlong King Glorious at Betfair Hollywood Park on December 22 by 6 1/4 lengths



when ridden for the first time by Victor Espinoza, who was back aboard Saturday.

"It's like the light bulb has gone on," said Sherman, who said the addition of Lasix and blinkers has contributed to California Chrome's improvement. He is three for five with both Lasix and blinkers.

"I didn't want to throw all that at him at once," Sherman said. "We didn't rush him. He's learned how to rate himself."

California Chrome got a perfect trip on Saturday. He sat third behind Better Bet and Life Is a Joy before making an eye-

catching move into the lane that catapulted him to the front. Sherman said California Chrome would make his next start in the grade II,

\$300,000 San Felipe Stakes on March 8. That 1 1/16-mile race is the last major prep for the grade I, \$1 million Santa Anita Derby on April 5. Sherman said California Chrome was nominated to the Triple Crown. Those nominations closed Saturday.

California Chrome, a chestnut-colored colt by Harris Farms' Lucky Pulpit out of the Not for Love mare Love the Chase, was bred and is owned by Steve Coburn and Perry Martin.—*continued at www.DRF.com, By Jay Privman*

\$200,000 California Cup Oaks

With blinkers refitted, longshot Susans Express sat a close second at the rail going to the far turn and found a seam three off the fence turning for home and powered through the lane with Kent Desormeaux to take Saturday's \$200,000 California Cup Oaks by 1 1/4 lengths, getting one mile on turf in 1:34.72.

Off at 65-1 in a field of 14 California-bred three-year-old fillies, Susans Express, trained and co-owned by Jorge Periban, tried the grass for the first time in the Oaks. Susans Express was winless in four starts since breaking her maiden sprinting for a \$50,000 claiming tag on August 30.

"Jorge told me exactly how to ride this filly and obviously it worked out," said Desormeux, who collected his second stakes win of the day. "She's a very nice filly. I'm just glad to be back here and I have to thank Jorgie for putting me on."

A filly by Magali Farms' Decarchy, Susans Express, owned by her breeder Ed Delaney, Carrillo and Periban, paid \$132.40, \$44.20 and \$20.60.

She picked up \$120,000 for the win, nearly quintupling her earnings to \$153,140.



Periban, a native of Mexico who operates a small Southern California stable, notched his first-ever stakes win in the United States.

"I knew this filly could run on the grass, and I made a little mistake last time when I took the blinkers off," said Periban. "I put them back. We did our best, and the jockey did a good job, too."

Anniversary Kitty, ridden by Corey Nakatani, broke from the far outside and made a protracted run wide-out through the lane to get up for second by a nose over Rovenna and Victor Espinoza.

Off at 6-1, Anniversary Kitty paid \$8.40 and \$6.60.

Nakatani noted that his mount took sick following a first-out maiden win on December 21, but had trained well coming into the Oaks.

Rovenna, ridden by Victor Espinoza, broke alertly from post 10, was caught fivewide into the first turn and settled into third down the backside in what appeared to be a perfect trip. She finished a length in front of Harlington's Rose and paid \$8.20 to show.—By Santa Anita Publicity





\$125,000 Donald Valpredo California Cup Sprint

Trainer Richard Baltas was all smiles following Saturday's \$125,000 Donald Valpredo California Cup Sprint for good reason, as his Big Macher, claimed seven starts back out of a maiden \$20,000 claimer on July 17 at the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club, had just powered to a 1 3/4-length win under Rafael Bejarano, covering six furlongs in a rapid 1:08.62.

Breaking from the outside post in a nine-horse field, Big Macher, the second choice at 2-1, sat second to longshot Coach Bob and Kent Desormeaux down the backside

and around the far turn before taking the lead at the top of the lane. "Rafael said he was going to sit far back, but I told him that if he breaks sharp not to be too far out of it," said Baltas. "I think that's where he likes to be, up

close, and he still can kick when he's up close. He just came into the race real good and it was a great day."

A four-year-old gelding by Beau Genius, Big Macher paid \$6.20, \$4.20 and \$3.80.

Owned by Tachycardia Stables or Mansor, Big Macher picked up \$75,000 for the win, hiking his earnings to \$146,428. It was his third win from eight starts.

Coach Bob, off at 23-1, set rapid fractions of :21.95, :44.62 and :56.47 and ran a huge second, finishing, a half-length in front of a fast finishing Kate's Event and Victor Espinoza.

"This is the quickest horse I've ridden in 10 years—no doubt," said Desormeaux. "The winner took the race from him. I love this horse. He has tons of heart."<u>—By Santa Anita Publicity</u>

\$125,000 Sunshine Millions Filly & Mare Turf Sprint

In her second career try down Santa Anita Park's unique 6 1/2-furlong hillside turf course, Ciao Bella Luna, with Kent Desormeaux up, sat second to Marks Mine and Frank Alvarado down the hill, took the lead outside Marks Mine crossing the dirt at the top of the lane and prevailed in a head and head duel with the pacesetter to the wire, winning Saturday's \$125,000 Sunshine Millions Filly & Mare Turf Sprint by a half length in 1:12.81.

Trained by Peter Miller, Ciao Bella Luna was the third choice at 5-1 in a field of 11 older fillies and mares bred in California and paid \$13.00, \$6.40 and \$4.80.

"I thought we would be way back early," said Desormeaux. "She broke horrible her last out so the only thing I did differently was I asked her to leave there better. "She carried me the rest of the way. She was in the bridle, just really floating along."

A four-year-old filly by Ballena Vista Farm's Tribal Rule, Ciao Bella Luna broke slowly in the grade II Monrovia down the hill on January 5, finishing an even fifth behind course specialist Pontchatrain.

"We bought her to be a synthetic horse and we thought maybe the turf would

suit her," said Miller, whose owner purchased her following a fourth place finish in the grade II Raven Run at Keeneland on October 19. "She ran well last time when we prepped in the Monrovia. This was the logical spot to come back and she ran super. Kent rode her great."

Owned by Rockingham Ranch, Ciao Bella Luna picked up \$75,000 for the win, hiking her earnings to \$262,110. She registered her fourth win from 12 starts.

Trained by Steve Specht, Marks Mine, who carved out splits of :22.45, :44.59 and 1:06.80, regained the lead from the winner a sixteenth of a mile out and ran too good to lose.

"When my filly crossed the dirt, she jumped," said Alvarado. "I thought I would have been there. I think her jumping cost us the race."

Based at Golden Gate Fields, Marks Mine was off at 9-1 and paid 10.40 and 6.40.

Tribal Spy, ridden by Irving Orozco, finished a head back of Marks Mine and paid \$7.60 to show.

Favored at 3-1, Unusual Hottie, ridden by Rafael Bejarano, finished fourth, 1 1/4 lengths behind Tribal Spy.<u>By Santa Anita Publicity</u>

Tommy Town Repeats As Leading Breeder

Led by champion three-year-old filly Doinghardtimeagain, Tommy Town Thoroughbreds is the champion breeder of California-foaled Thoroughbreds by earnings for the second consecutive year.

The award will be presented at the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association's Annual Meeting and Awards Dinner, to be held February 10 at The Claremont Hotel Club & Spa in Berkeley.

Tommy Town Thoroughbreds finished with foal earnings of \$3,089,448. Doinghardtimeagain, a homebred daughter of Tommy Town stallion Ministers Wild Cat, contributed the biggest chunk of that total, \$388,240, including a win in the grade II Hollywood Oaks.

Tommy Town Thoroughbreds finished first in earnings in 2012 with \$2,561,735, also led by Doinghardtimeagain with \$198,500. Tommy Town Thoroughbreds also was the California champion breeder in 2009.

Away 17 months, six-year-old Lakerville smoked late under Corey Nakatani to take Sunday's \$75,000 Clockers' Corner Stakes by 1 1/4 lengths, getting 6 1/2 furlongs down Santa Anita Park's hillside turf course in 1:11.75.

Well in-hand approaching the dirt crossing at the top of the lane, Nakatani was about five lengths behind a three-horse spread consisting of early leader Ankeny Hill, El Commodore and 2-1 favorite Ready for More.

Nakatani set after the leaders crossing back to the turf and overhauled Ankeny Hill and Edwin Maldonado inside the sixteenth pole to comfortably hold off a late run from Sweet Swap and Rafael Bejarano.—By Santa Anita Publicity

Gross, Average, Median Increases At Barretts



A yearling son of Midnight Lute and a two-year-old son of Majestic Warrior each brought \$70,000 to top the Barretts January Mixed Sale that saw increases in nearly every category. With the exception of broodmares, the average for all cate-

gories of horses rose, leading to an overall sale average of \$8,683, up four percent over the 2013 figure of \$8,348. This year's January 27 sale at the Hinds Pavilion in Pomona, Calif., saw 224 sell for \$1,944,900, compared to 184 selling for \$1,536,100 a year ago. Fire Agency Adopts Large Animal Rescue Guidelines

Firefighters who respond to horse-related emergencies have a new tool now that the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) has adopted guidelines for carrying out large animal rescues. The guidelines are designed to ensure the safety of animals and humans during rescues, said Rebecca Gimenez, PhD, president and primary instructor of Technical Large Animal Emergency.

In December 2013, the NFPA-an international organization that provides codes, standards, training, and education for firefighters and other responders-adopted the "Standard," which includes guidelines specifically addressing animal rescues. It is the first time such guidelines have been included in an NFPA standard, Gimenez said. _____ at www.theHorse.com, By Pat Raia



Compared to last week: Prices were firm to 5.00 higher in most areas, with advancements up to 10.00 higher in the Imperial Valley. The hay market continues to march higher, as this is the driest January on record in the state of California. There has been a high pressure ridge lurking off the coast for the last 13 months which is responsible for blocking winter storms and precipitation from reaching California, according to the Daily Mail. Producers are already concerned about the water situation next year. According to the Wall Street Journal, most farmers haven't received water they'rer due for since 2008 when federal regulators began restricting water exports from the Delta to residents in the south to protect "threatened" fish such as the smelt and the salmon. The federal regulations have caused millions of acre-feet of water to be flushed into the Bay instead of being sent down the line to irrigate crop lands in the Central and Southern regions of the state. Livestock producers are beginning to search for hay outside their normal marketing areas, with reports

of hay moving out of Oregon, Nevada, and the Imperial Valley to try and meet demand while supplies last. Trade activity was active on very good buyer demand. All prices reported FOB at the stack or barn unless otherwise noted.
