Red Outlaw In Tough Baffle Win



Red Outlaw, with Joel Rosario up, prevailed in a head and head battle the length of the stretch to take Sunday's \$97,450 Baffle Stakes by a head over favored Gangnam Guy and Victor Espinoza, getting the about 6 1/2 furlongs down Santa Anita Park's hillside turf course in 1:12.05.

The second choice at 5-2 in a field of seven three-year-olds, Red Outlaw broke alertly from post six and sat a close second down the hill to longshot Noble Metal (GB) through fractions of :21.64, :43.69 and 1:06.39. He was carried wide by the pacesetter crossing the dirt at the top of the lane and was immediately engaged to his outside by the favorite as the field straightened for home and those two bumped a furlong out, resulting in a stewards' inquiry.

After a review of several minutes, the stewards ruled unanimously that the contact did not affect the original order of finish and they let the original result stand.—*continued at <http://www.santaanita.com>, From Santa Anita Publicity*

Tamarando Pointed Toward Spiral Stakes

California-bred Tamarando and Dance With Fate, the one-two finishers in the El Camino Real Derby (grade III) at Golden Gate Fields on February 15, exited the race in good order and will likely make their next starts in Kentucky.

Tamarando came from last in a field of eight to win the 1 1/8-mile El Camino Real Derby by a half-length over Dance With Fate, who took second by 2 1/4 lengths over 6-5 favorite Enterprising.

"He came out of the race real well," said trainer Jerry Hollendorfer of Tamarando, who earned his third career stakes victory at odds of 2-1. All three of Tamarando's stakes wins have come on all-weather surfaces, including the Del Mar Futurity (grade I) on Polytrack, the Real Quiet Stakes on Cushion Track at Betfair Hollywood Park and the El Camino Real Derby on Tapeta.—*continued at www.BloodHorse.com, By Blood-Horse Staff*

An IRS Audit is disagreeable. It's time consuming, requiring you and/or your accountant to gather up your supporting documentation. Perhaps you can end up paying additional taxes. Some things trigger an audit, so here are some tips to help you avoid them.

The Schedule C Form requires you to enter an occupational code number for your business. The correct number for Thoroughbred Racing and Breeding is 711210. Failure to enter this number on the Schedule C can get you an IRS Audit.

at Second Chances CA (SCC). Among her California Thoroughbred Breeder Association (CTBA) duties, the foaling, and now breeding season, Greene's impact on this program has remained unmatched.

"It's only through the support of our industry that our program exists", states Julie Baker, former assistant trainer and now SCC Equine Program Director. "The retired Thoroughbreds we use in our program have all raced in California at one time or another. Sue's support is just one indicator that as we are receiving some recognition now in the industry, for training grooms and re-training the retired horses fit for adoption."

Early in its second year, SCC facilitates a three month version of the Groom Elite Horseman's Education (vocational) program and provides EAGALA sessions, or equine assisted psychotherapy (the Equine Assisted Growth and Learning Association), to former inmates of Stanislaus County in Modesto, California. SCC is also the only California satellite facility for the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation (<http://www.trfinc.org/>).

Opening up her farm in Oakdale, Greene's Woodbridge Farm has become a venue for student field trips to see what a real working farm consists of. From sale horses, to rehab, breeding and foaling, students get to see first-hand how it's done from a long-standing professional in the industry.

"I am just happy to help, and so happy for the horses" states Greene. The Second Chances program was able to provide a home for Greene's Iza Bon Bon, (winner of \$300,000-plus, producer of winners over \$500,000) when she finished her broodmare career.

"I applaud Sue for her zealous efforts for the horse racing industry. From a foal's first breath to the very end, to the CTBA, all the way to Sacramento. We are so lucky to have her here in Northern California", Julie says. Lookn Wild Win Streak At 9

Lookn Wild, a six-year-old son of Tommy Town Thoroughbreds' Ministers Wild Cat, made it nine-in-a-row with another gate-to-wire win in a Turf Paradise allowance optional claiming race at 5 1/2 furlongs on February 12.

Lookn Wild has won 14 races from 30 lifetime starts with earnings of \$113,405.

Bred in California by Darren Carraway and Judd Whitworth this gelding is out of the Smoke Glacken broodmare Smokin Sasa. He has won at seven different racetracks during his four-year campaign.

Ministers Wild Cat was the fourth ranked 2013 sire in California with progeny earnings over \$3.5 million. He sired seven 2013 stakes winners who have won 11 stakes led by: grade II winner Doinghardtimeagain, grade III winner Tiz a Minister, Curvy Cat, Going For a Spin and Hollywood Dreams. Santa Anita Earns Safety Re-Accreditation

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA) announced February 14 that Santa Anita Park, site of the Breeders' Cup World Championships for the third straight year in 2014, has earned re-accreditation from the NTRA Safety and Integrity Alliance.



Santa Anita's re-accreditation followed a complete review of all racing operations at the facility. "The Great Race Place" was first accredited in 2009; all accreditations and re-accreditations carry an effective period of two years.

During the latest Alliance inspection of Santa Anita, best practices were identified in virtually every primary area of focus for the Alliance.

"Between the Breeders' Cup and its two annual meets, Santa Anita is expected to host 27 grade I events in 2014, about a quarter of the grade I stakes in North America," said Mike Ziegler, the Executive Director of the NTRA Safety and Integrity Alliance. "With so much on the line, participants and bettors need to know that our sport's most high-profile racetracks are consistently striving to protect horses, jockeys, and the public."—*continued at* www.BloodHorse.com, By [Blood-Horse Staff](#)

Del Mar plans to install a dirt track for its 2015 summer season, replacing the existing synthetic surface, track president Joe Harper said Tuesday.

Harper cautioned that the move to a dirt track was contingent on finding the "right material" and gaining the necessary permits, including approval from the California Coastal Commission.

"I hope it happens," he said. "I think that's our plan. It's one step at a time with making sure we get the right permits."

California Chrome Works At Los Alamitos For San Felipe

California Cup Derby winner California Chrome worked four furlongs at Los Alamitos Saturday in 47.80 in preparation for his foray into open company in the Grade II, \$300,000 San Felipe Stakes on March 8, where it is expected he will face, among others, the Bob Baffert-trained Bayern, smashing 15-length allowance winner on Thursday.

"I got him galloping out (five furlongs) in 1:00 3/5," said trainer Art Sherman, who had his regular exercise rider, Jay Conklin, aboard the California-bred son of Lucky Pulpit. Sherman was philosophical about facing tougher foes in the San Felipe.

"We can't duck anybody," he said. "We need points (to qualify for the Kentucky Derby on May 3). I'll just keep my fingers crossed." The San Felipe is worth 50 Kentucky Derby points to the winner.—[Publicity, Stable Notes By Ed Golden](#)

Non-Member Registration Fees Increase

Registration fees for California-bred and California-sired foals will increase as of April 1, 2014 for non-members of the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association (CTBA), it was announced on January 30.

Registration fees for non-members of the CTBA will be \$200 per foal if applied for by September 30 of yearling year and \$250 if applied for after September 30 of

yearling year but before the following January 1.

Registration fees for member fees stay the same—\$100 per foal if applied for by September 30 of yearling year and \$125 if applied for after September 30 of yearling year but before the following January 1.

The fee will remain the same for two-year-olds and older: \$750.

Horse Farm Liability

A century ago, most personal injury claims were governed by a common-sense legal principle called "assumption of the risk." The idea is a simple one: If an individual knows that an activity is potentially dangerous but voluntarily takes part in the activity anyway, the participant is responsible for injuries he or she

might suffer. The participant, in other words, assumes the risk of being injured.

California-Bred Flashback: Georgie Boy

On February 10, 2008, Georgie Boy, a son of Tribal Rule, won the grade II, \$150,000 San Vicente Stakes for three-year-olds at Santa Anita Park, with Into Mischief second and Massive Drama third in a field of four. Georgie Boy was trained by Kathy Walsh and ridden by Rafael Bejarano. He ran the seven furlongs in 1:20.01 and won by 3 1/4 lengths at odds of 5-2. Georgie Boy was the first of seven foals out of the Peterhof mare Ippodamia. The San Vicente was Georgie Boy's third win in six starts. He won five other stakes, including the grade I Del Mar Futurity, and three grade IIs, and placed in two other graded stakes. He finished his career with six wins in 11 starts and earnings of \$788,634. Georgie Boy was bred by owner George Schwary and foaled at Old English Rancho in Sanger.
