Poker Bills Would Exclude Racing

Two Internet poker bills have been introduced in the California Legislature for consideration this year, but neither includes the racing industry on the short list of entities eligible for licensing.

Josh Rubenstein, Senior Vice-President for development of Del Mar Thoroughbred Club and spokesman for a coalition of racing interests, said the bills were disappointing in that regard but were by no means the final word.

"That's the initial language. But the way bills start out and the way they finish, as we have seen, are usually quite different," Rubenstein said by phone February 26.

The measures were among hundreds introduced February 21 in time to meet the submission deadline for 2014 Legislation. Senate Bill 1366, authored by Sen. Lou Correa, and Assembly Bill 2291, by Assemblyman Reggie Jones-Sawyer, received their first readings on Monday, February 24.—continued at www.BloodHorse.com, By Jack Shinar

Ambitious Brew Wins Sensational Star Stakes

Ambitious Brew, ridden by Brice Blanc, got a perfect stalking trip and upset favored Lakerville to win the \$100,000 Sensational Star Stakes for California-breds by 1 1/2 lengths, covering 6 1/2 furlongs down Santa Anita Park's hillside turf course in 1:12 flat on February 22.

The 4-5 favorite in a field of six older

horses bred in California, Lakerville, ridden by Gary Stevens, finished second, a half length in front of Summer Hit and Rafael Bejarano.

A four-year-old Tizbud (Harris Farms) gelding trained by Marty Jones, Ambitious Brew sat third early, stalking pacesetting longshot Coach Bob and Summer Hit through fractions of 22.00, 44.22 and 1:06.28 and hit the front three-wide a furlong out.

"Mike (Smith, regular rider) was out of town today and I worked him the other morning," said Blanc. "...I talked to Mike a little about the horse, I watched the replays and it seemed pretty straight forward. He has plenty of tactical speed and this race looked like it had a few speed horses in

As Strong As Ever

A quarter-century of auctions under the Barretts banner will be celebrated on Monday, March 3, when the Pomonabased company hosts its 25th Anniversary March Select Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training. Back on March 5 and 6, 1990,

Barretts Equine Sales hosted its inaugural sale and the Hinds Pavilion at Fairplex will once again be the venue for this year's offering of juveniles by Barretts Sales & Racing.

Twenty-five years ago, 196 of the 270 two-year-olds through the sales ring sold for \$16,405,000, while 2014 will see a catalog of 140 entries, 14 of whom are California-breds, hoping to improve on last year's totals for 61 juveniles sold of \$8,751,000 in gross receipts and average and median prices of \$143,459 and \$100,000, respectively. The 2013 buyback rate was 33.7 percent.

Last year's \$675,000 sale-topper Corfu has had a busy time since then, winning the Saratoga Special Stakes (grade II) in stakes record time

and earning \$214,200 overall before retiring to stud at Bridlewood Farm in Florida for this year's breeding season. Other graduates of this annual March auction who have also performed well during the last 12 months include: the 2013 Champagne Stakes (grade I) winner Havana, a \$575,000 purchase last year who has since earned \$708,000; the \$\$422,140-earner Gervinho, a grade II winner of 2013 whose \$120,000 reserve was not achieved in 2012; and Sum of the Parts, sold for \$150,000 three years ago and now a dual graded stakes winner of \$806,543.

Following the Training Preview starting at 10:00 am on Thursday, Feb. 27, this year's sale will commence at 2:00 pm on March 3, featuring sire power second to none.

Besides offering sons and daughters of eight of last year's top 10 national sires, namely Awesome Again, Giant's Causeway, Harlan's Holiday, Kitten's Joy, Macho Uno, Malibu Moon, Unbridled's Song and War Front, the catalog also boasts a filly by the internationally renowned Galileo. Also among the entries are progeny by many other prominent national sires, including Any Given Saturday, Artie Schiller, Candy Ride (Arg), City Zip, Colonel John, Curlin, Dunkirk, Elusive Quality, Ghostzapper, Into Mischief, Lemon Drop Kid, Majestic Warrior, Midnight Lute, Pioneerof the Nile, Scat Daddy, Sky Mesa, Smart Strike, Street Boss, Street Cry (Ire), Street Sense and Tale of the Cat.

Plus, there are two-year-olds from the first crops of grade I winners Discreetly Mine, Lookin At Lucky, Majesticperfection, Midshipman, Quality Road, Super Saver and Tale of Ekati, while leading local sires with juvenile representatives include Desert Code, Dixie Chatter and Tribal Rule.

In 2014, the March sale will feature 55 separate consignments from 17 individual consignors.

Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree Stables, the leading consignor

at this auction for the past three years, has 23 entries cataloged. They are led by a noteworthy trio commprising of a Zensational filly out of a Giant's Causeway half-sister to the grade I-winning California champion Brother Derek, an

Irish-bred daughter of Galileo out of 2003 Breeders' Cup Distaff (grade I) winner and \$2,051,160-earner Adoration, and a Tale of the Cat half-brother to grade I winner Forest Secrets.

Among the 20 juveniles being consigned by Eddie Woods are: a filly by Concord Point from the family of the 2009 Eclipse Champion Three-Year-Old Male, Summer Bird; a son of Street Cry (Ire) and Tapit's grade I winner Careless Jewel; and a daughter of Munnings out of a stakes-winning half-sister to the 2012 and 2103 Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint (grade I) winner Mizdirection.

The 16-strong Havens Bloodstock Agency consignment is headlined by a Congrats colt


out of graded stakes winner Angela's Love, while Steven Venosa's SGV Thoroughbreds group of a dozen features both a Henrythenavigator half-sister to 2012 Best Pal Stakes (grade II) winner Know More and an Indian Charlie colt from the family of the 2006 Eclipse champion and 2007 Kentucky Derby (grade I) winner, Street Sense.

Under the care of Mike Puhich, Pegasus Training Center is represented by 11 two-year-olds, including a son of Bernardini out of a half-sister to Real Quiet, also a Kentucky Derby-winning Eclipse champion, and a Dixie Chatter half-sister to California champion Ismene.

Also with an 11-strong representation is Sequel Bloodstock. Becky Thomas' most notable entries are a Desert Party colt from the family of the grade I-winning California champion Pirate's Revenge and a Line of David half-brother to last year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies (grade I) winner Ria Antonia.

Additional entries worth a mention are: a Ghostzapper filly out of a half-sister to the dam of dual 2013 grade I winner Big Blue Kitten with Niall Brennan Stables; a son of Tiz Wonderful from the family of two-time Eclipse champion Silverbulletday with Adrian Gonzalez's Checkmate Thoroughbreds; a daughter of Pioneerof the Nile out of a half-sister to the Eclipse Horse of the Year, Holy Bull, with Bruno De Berdt and David Scanlon's Excel Bloodstock; a Pulpit colt out of a half-sister to 2010 grade I winner Paddy O'Prado from Hartley/De Renzo Thoroughbreds; a Bellamy Road half-sister to 2011 grade I winner Ultimate Eagle with McCarthy Bloodstock; and a Northern Afleet filly from the family of Santa Anita Handicap (grade I) winner Rock Hard Ten with Stephens Thoroughbreds.

The audio of this entire board meeting is available on the CHRB Website (www.chrb.ca.gov) under the webcast link. In brief:

- The board approved the application for the Los Angeles Turf Club to conduct
 a race meet at Santa Anita Park from April 25 through June 29, essentially a
 continuation of the current meet in Arcadia that runs through April 20, with
 a four-day break in between. The application was approved pending clarification of the schedule of stake races historically run in Southern California.
- Several commissioners reported on working with racetracks on the development of fire evacuation plans as well as fire prevention measures. These efforts will continue and their progress will be detailed in public reports.
- The board approved for 45-day public notice a proposed regulatory amendment to eliminate the maximum daily restriction on samples that may be tested and to give the CHRB access to horses stabled at non-CHRB regulated facilities by requiring them to be registered in advance of racing and thereby subject to out-of-competition testing.
- The board voted to direct portions of the existing takeout from exotic wagering
 pools to help fund workers' compensation programs for thoroughbreds, quarter
 horses, standardbreds and fairs, within the limits authorized by statute.
- The board voted to deduct a portion of market access fees generated by Advance Deposit Wagering in Southern California to help offset stabling and vanning expenses at southern racetracks and training facilities, as permitted by statute.
- The board authorized the distribution of \$37,403 in race day charity proceeds by the Los Angeles Turf Club II to 13 beneficiaries.
- The board approved a two-year license for the Game Play Network Inc. to conduct Advance Deposit Wagering once they provide several outstanding items required of all ADW companies. While Game Play will operate a traditional ADW website for all, the major focus will be to attract non-racing fans that play online games.—<u>From the CHRB</u>

CHRB Questions Santa Anita Stakes

Santa Anita Park gained approval for its first spring/summer meet from the California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) February 21, and presented a stakes schedule for the nine-week stand that looks quite a bit like Hollywood Park, which it is replacing.

The meet follows a brief break from the Arcadia track's winter/spring stand and will run for 40 days, April 25 through June 29. The schedule calls for racing on a Thursday through Sunday schedule with an additional card for Memorial Day, May 26. The regular first post will be 1 p.m. PDT, expect for twilight Friday programs, which will begin at 3 p.m. There will be an 11 a.m. first post for each of the Triple Crown cards.

Santa Anita will run 33 stakes, most of those taken over from betfair hollywood park, which closed for racing in December and is expected to be demolished in 2014, then replaced by commercial and residential development.

Nineteen graded stakes are on the new Santa Anita schedule, including traditional grade I fixtures such as the Gamely May 26, the American Oaks May 31, the Vanity June 14, and the Triple Bend Handicap and Hollywood Gold Cup June 28.—continued at http://www.BloodHorse.com, By Jack Shinar

Cal-Bred Pair In Santa Ysabel

Dual stakes winner Swiss Lake Yodeler and fellow California-bred Anniversary Kitty are entered in Saturday's \$100,000 grade III Santa Ysabel Stakes for three-year-old fillies at Santa Anita Park.

Swiss Lake Yodeler is by Lovacres Ranch's Swiss Yodeler, out of the Meadowlake mare Domasco Lake, was bred by owners Larry and Marianne Williams and trained by Jerry Hollendorfer. She has three wins in five starts, earnings of \$235,850 and is coming off an 11th in the January 25 California Cup Oaks.

Anniversary Kitty is by Tribal Rule, out of the Bertrando mare Justanotherblonde, was bred by Mike Abraham, is owned by Highlander Racing Stable and trained by Craig Dollase. She has one win in two starts, earnings of \$65,000 and is coming off a second in the January 25 California Cup Oaks.—continued at http://www.ctba.com,

California Chrome Preps For San Felipe

California Chrome worked six furlongs at Los Alamitos Saturday morning in 1:11.80 under regular rider Victor Espinoza as the California-bred son of Lucky Pulpit moved closer to a start in the grade II, \$300,000 San Felipe Stakes at 1 1/16 miles on March 8.

"I'm real happy with the work," trainer Art Sherman said. "I got him galloping out seven furlongs in 1:25. He'll have one more breeze at Los Al and we'll ship to Santa Anita five days before the race for schooling and final preparations. Victor said he went really nice."

Meanwhile, on Friday, Shared Belief shipped from Santa Anita Park to Golden Gate Fields in the Northern California town of Berkeley.

The undefeated Eclipse Award winner as male two-year-old champion of 2013, who had been a Future Book favorite for the Kentucky Derby, has been recovering from a quarter crack on his right front foot.

While he had been galloping on Santa Anita's conventional dirt track, the gelded son of Candy Ride had not had a recorded workout.—<u>Santa Anita Publicity</u>, <u>Stable Notes By Ed Golden</u>

Thoroughbred Hoof Care: Foal To Racehorse To Sport Horse


Thoroughbreds are born to run. But to satisfy this need for speed, the horse must have a strong foundation on which to gallop—we're talking about his hooves.


