## Santa Anita Handicap Handle Increases 23%



The Santa Anita Handicap program on March 8 produced a robust 23 percent increase in total handle over last year, the track reported.

Wagering on the blockbuster program, topped by a record third Santa Anita Handicap (grade I) win by Game On Dude and the emergence of three-year-old talent California Chrome in the San Felipe Stakes (grade II), totaled \$22,589,082.

## Pressure Off California Chrome's Trainer

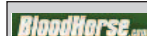
Following a dazzling win from California Chrome in the grade II, San Felipe Stakes on March 8 at Santa Anita Park, trainer Art Sherman says he can concentrate on the best way to get to this year's Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands (grade I).

"I'm not making any plans (for his next race), you know what I mean?" said the 77-year-old Sherman, whose long years of toil are being rewarded by the unlikely California-bred colt. "I'm in the Derby now; I've got enough points. That took a lot of pressure off me. I'm just going to play it by ear. There is a chance we might go to the Santa Anita Derby (grade I)."

Speaking by phone to the Santa Anita publicity department March 9, Sherman added, "The horse has to let me know. He came out of the race good, he ate up last night. I was happy. He's a cool horse. I just don't want to do too much with him."

## Fees For California-Bred/Sired Foals Will Increase April 1 For Non-members

Registration fees for California-bred and California-sired foals will increase as of April 1, 2014, for non-members of the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association (CTBA).

Registration fees for non-members of the CTBA will be \$200 per foal if applied for by September 30 of yearling year and \$250 if applied for after September 30 of yearling year but before the following January 1.



California Thoroughbred Breeders Association

Fees for member stay the same—\$100 per foal if applied for by September 30 of yearling year and \$125 if applied for after September 30 of yearling year but before the following January 1.

The fee will remain the same for two-year-olds and older: \$750.

## Time To Ride Introduces '100 Day Horse Challenge'

Time to Ride, an American Horse Council (AHC) initiative, has introduced a grass-roots effort designed to engage 100,000 new people with horses in a 100-day period.

The "100 Day Horse Challenge" is a nationwide campaign designed to expose new people to hands-on horse activities while providing \$100,000 in cash and prizes to participating stables and organizations. The program will enlist 1,000 stables, horse clubs, venues, organizations, or individuals to register as an official "Time to Ride Host" and compete in the 100-day challenge, which kicks off June 1. Participating hosts will be divided into small, medium, and large divisions by size, and challenged to provide a hands-on, interactive horse experience—including riding, grooming, and learning about horsemanship, among other activities—to as many new participants as possible.

"This program incentivizes the segment of our industry that can truly open the doors to a first-ever horse experience for thousands of people," said Time to Ride spokeswoman Patti Colbert. "It will also educate our hosts on some best practices in growing their businesses."

Individual cash prizes up to \$25,000, as well as stable equipment, feed, veterinary supplies, and more, will be awarded to the hosts that garner the greatest number of new horse enthusiasts.

The challenge is open to the first 1,000 hosts interested in growing the horse industry, including stables, instructors, clubs, events, recreational riders, equine service professionals, veterinarians, Thoroughbred and Quarter Horse racetracks, and more. Registered hosts will receive extensive marketing support from Time to Ride, including listing on the Time to Ride map with special denotation as an official Time to Ride Host.

## Big 'Cap Seems Like Olden Days

Reputations and rivalries are forged in the Big 'Cap.

First run in 1935, the Santa Anita Handicap became the West Coast's most prestigious racing event because it consistently brought out the best between people and horses. Known in the early years as the "Hundred Grandeur," it often attracted the best runners in the nation. So many wanted to come to California that for many years, Santa Anita Park made its weight assignments for the 1 1/4-mile classic in December so that those with horses under consideration could make their shipping plans.

## CHRB Issues Advisory For Cobalt Monitoring

The California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) has begun monitoring cobalt levels in horses that are competing in the state and in certain necropsy specimens.

In an advisory to horsemen issued March 4, CHRB equine medical director Dr. Rick Arthur said that cobalt toxicity has been associated with myocardial and other organ pathology in humans and other animals. High cobalt levels have been associated with the parenteral or oral administration of cobalt salts.

While there is no documented evidence of cobalt toxicity in race horses, the CHRB considers the administration of cobalt salts a potential equine health and safety issue, Arthur said.—[continued at www.BloodHorse.com](http://www.BloodHorse.com), By BloodHorse Staff

### Fossil Evidence Of Laminitis In Ancient Horses

Over the past several million years, horses have evolved from the Eocene era's Labrador-sized mammal to today's modern, domesticated equine. In studying the Equus species' fossil record, researchers have discovered evidence of sidebone, ringbone, arthritis, navicular disease, and other hoof conditions, but until recently they've documented no reports of laminitis. Many have chalked this up to a lack of human influence and predation of vulnerable animals, but Lane Wallett, DVM, a PhD candidate in the University of Florida College of Veterinary Medicine's Department of Physiological Sciences, wasn't convinced. So she conducted a study of ancient equine coffin bones and presented her findings at the 2013 International Equine Conference on Laminitis and Diseases of the Foot, held November 1-3 in West Palm Beach, Florida.

"Chronic laminitis in horses has long been conceptualized as a disease of domestication, a result of husbandry practices replacing wild behavior and nutritional patterns," Wallett said. "However, the growing body of research suggests that the disease may be common in modern feral horses."—*continued at [www.theHorse.com](http://www.theHorse.com), By Alexandra Beckstett, The Horse Managing Editor*

### Why A Veterinarian Should Vaccinate Your Horse

**Question:** Why can't we give our horses their vaccines ourselves? My barn friend said my shots would not count if I give them myself.

**Answer:** Thank you for sending in your question about vaccinating your horse. Vaccinations are critical to help protect your horse against debilitating and potentially life-threatening diseases such as rabies, West Nile virus, Eastern equine encephalomyelitis and Western equine encephalomyelitis, along with some additional diseases such as equine herpesvirus, equine influenza and Potomac horse fever.

### Windy's Halo

On March 16, 1997, Windy's Halo, a son of Present Value, won the \$90,000 Crystal Water Handicap at Santa Anita Park, with Gastown second and Dresser third in a field of seven. Windy's Halo was trained by Henry Moreno and ridden by Julio Garcia. He ran the mile on turf in 1:35 4/5 and won by three-quarters of a length at odds of 20-1. Windy's Halo was the first of nine foals out of the Agitate mare Windy Tate, who also produced stakes winner Mr. Joe C. The Crystal Water was Windy's Halo's fourth win in 26 starts. He also won the Bosselman/Gus Fonner Handicap and placed in five other stakes, finishing his career with 15 wins in 86 starts and earnings of \$464,366. Windy's Halo was bred by Cumbari Stable and Eddie Delahoussaye, foaled at SLU Inc. in Sanger and was owned by D & L Trucking.
