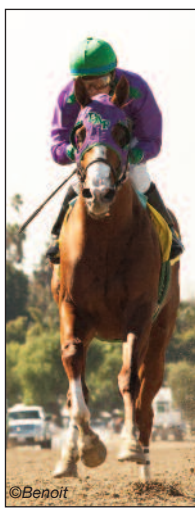

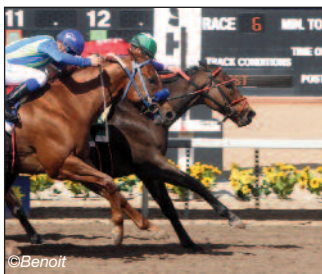


## Halo Dolly Nearly A Millionaire

Halo Dolly made an easy lead and coasted to a gate-to-wire score in the \$100,000 Dream of Summer Stakes at Santa Anita Park on March 23, prevailing by 1 1/2 lengths over favored Unusual Way while getting one mile in 1:35.73.

Ridden by Corey Nakatani, Halo Dolly, one of two Jerry Hollendorfer-trained horses in the five-horse field for older fillies and mares bred or sired in California, cleared the favorite, who stumbled leaving the gate with Edwin Maldonado, by two lengths

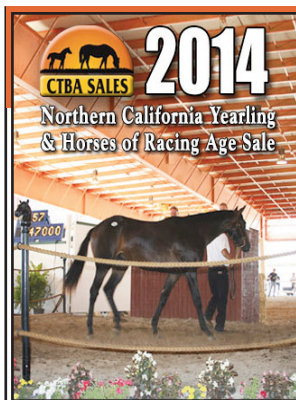

Since the sale returned under the direction of the CTBA in 2004, it has produced stakes winners such as: Bai and Bai, an earner of \$724,983; grade II winner Sierra Sunset; and grade III winner Autism Awareness.

## TOC Announces Annual Owner Awards

The Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC) has announced the winners of its 2013 statistical awards for leading California owners. Hronis Racing, LLC was leading owner in purse money won in California last year; the partnership of Jerry Hollendorfer and George Todaro led all owners by number of wins for the second consecutive year; and Glen Hill Farm took the leading owner award for California stakes wins. Brian Decker was selected as Rookie of the Year.

Hronis Racing runners earned a total of \$1,976,632 in California last year, including five stakes wins. Top earners were Grade II Del Mar Handicap winner Vagabond Shoes, Grade II Santa Barbara Handicap winner Lady of Shamrock, Rising Legend, winner of the Oceanside Stakes, Sky High Gal, and lotapa.

Hollendorfer and Todaro won a remarkable 38 races from 125 starts in California last year for total purse earnings of \$1,033,195. Their leading earners were Lady of Fifty, winner of the Grade I Clement L. Hirsch Stakes, and Zeewat, winner of the California Derby and Damascus Stakes.

Glen Hill Farm recorded 11 stakes wins in California for a total of \$1,185,000. Their stakes winners were Marketing Mix, winner of the Grade I Gamely Stakes and Grade III Sunset Handicap, Wishing Gate, winner of the Grade II San Clemente Handicap and Grade III Autumn Miss Stakes, Ponchatrain, winner of the Grade III Senator Ken Maddy Stakes and Unzip Me Stakes, Customer Base, winner of the Grade III Robert J. Frankel and Lucie Manet stakes, Global View, winner of the Grade III Generous Stakes, and La Puente Stakes winner Procurement.

Decker, who formed Star Stables with two buddies whose eight-year-old sons played on his son's baseball team, had 16 starts for earnings of \$102,085. They campaigned Magestic Stinger, Big Wags, Iron Joe T. and Lovemeister in 2013.

All winners will be recognized at TOC's Annual Meeting at the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club on Saturday, August 23rd.

## CHRB Meeting Summary For Friday, March 21

The California Horse Racing Board (CHRB) conducted its regular meeting Friday, March 21, 2014, at Cal Expo. Chairman Chuck Winner presided. 1st Vice Chair Bo Derek, 2nd Vice Chair Richard Rosenberg, and Commissioners Madeline Auerbach, Steve Beneto, Jesse Choper, and George Krikorian were in attendance.



The audio of this entire board meeting is available on the CHRB Website ([www.chrb.ca.gov](http://www.chrb.ca.gov)) under the Webcast link. In brief:

- The board finalized the Northern California racing calendar for 2015 by allocating racing dates for the latter half of the year to Golden Gate Fields and the northern fairs. The board earlier approved the racing calendar for the first half of 2015 by allocating dates for the current meet at Golden Gate Fields through June 15. The racing season will continue with dates allocated to the Alameda County Fair in Pleasanton (June 17 through July 6) followed by the State Fair at Cal Expo (July 9 through July 26), the Sonoma County Fair in Santa Rosa (July 30 through August 16), the Humboldt County Fair in Ferndale (August 19 through August 30) and somewhat concurrently at Golden Gate Fields (August 21 through September 13), the San Joaquin County Fair in Stockton (September 18 through September 27), the Big Fresno Fair in Fresno (October 1 through October 12), and finally at Golden Gate (October 15 through December 20). The various locations will designate their precise racing dates within these block allocations when each submits its license application three months before the start of its meet.
- The board approved for 45-day public notice a proposed regulatory amendment to require that authorized bleeder

medication be administered by independent, third-party veterinarians along with a requirement for a prescription for furosemide (Lasix).

- Commissioner Auerbach reported that the newly designed stakes schedules in Southern California following the closure of Hollywood Park will include all stakes races historically run in Southern California.
- The board agreed to write a letter to California Insurance Commissioner Dave Jones urging him to find a resolution to a newly raised problem with underwriting for catastrophic injury insurance for California jockeys. This policy is in addition to workers' compensation insurance that continues to cover all jockeys and fully pays for all medical expenses relating to a work-related accident.
- The board voted to support Senate Concurrent Resolution 95, which would designate the race track at Cal Expo as the Kirk Breed Memorial Race Track, honoring the late Kirk Breed, who served as general manager of Cal Expo and also on its board of Directors before being named CHRB executive director.
- The Department of Finance reported on an ongoing operational audit of the CHRB, prompted by a reorganization of state government last year that placed the CHRB within the Business, Consumer Services and Housing Agency.
- The board approved for 45-day public notice a proposed regulator amendment to delete from the license application the requirement for synthetic surfaces and to require the past two years of stakes schedules, a listing of pari-mutuel takeout rates, and the names and working schedules of racing veterinarians.—CHRB

## Increased Security For Santa Anita Derby

In an effort to safeguard the health and welfare of horses and riders, Santa Anita Park officials have announced they will provide round-the-clock surveillance of all horses entered in the Santa Anita Derby (gr. I) beginning 72 hours before the April 5 race.

The security measure, designed to safeguard the health and welfare of horses and riders, will be similar to that provided for the 2013 Derby and for the 2013 Breeders' Cup in Arcadia.

The California Horse Racing Board will also have an increased security presence on the backside of Santa Anita for Derby Day. In addition to the usual CHRB enforcement personnel at Santa Anita,

additional investigators and safety stewards are being brought in from Sacramento and Los Alamitos.

The added CHRB staffing will augment Santa Anita's stakes race security, allowing for broad stable area coverage for the Derby program, which also includes the Santa Anita Oaks (gr. I) and three other stakes on an 11-race card.—[continued at www.bloodhorse.com](http://www.bloodhorse.com)

## New Immigration Bill Introduced

Congressman Andy Harris (R-MD) recently introduced H.R. 4238 to amend the Immigration and Nationality Act that provides requirements for employers of H-2B nonimmigrant workers and is the basic body of immigration law.



Rep. Harris' bill includes, among its provisions, an amendment that covers returning workers and how they impact the annual cap on the number of H-2B visas available to employers. Specifically, H.R. 4238 reinstates the returning worker exemption so that those workers who complied with the terms of previous H-2B visas can return to the U.S. and not count against the cap of 66,000 visas. Of

that number, 33,000 are made available for the first half of the fiscal year and 33,000 for the second half. The first half cap already has been reached.

The legislation also clarifies the methodology used to determine the prevailing wage rate that H-2B employers must pay and ensures that workers receive compensation that is both fair and reflective of current market conditions.

The H-2B visa program is used by many industries, including horse racing, to access temporary seasonal workers when domestic help is unavailable. Horse trainers typically use the program to hire grooms and other barn help.—NTRA
