## Seven-Figure Colt Leads Strong Barretts March Select Sale Of Two-Year-OIds In Training

Led by the buying power of the Coolmore group, the Barretts March select sale of two-yearolds in training at Fairplex Park in Pomona, California., showed gains in gross, average and median prices on Monday.

Demi O'Byrne, seated with Michael Tabor of Coolmore, bought the sale topper, a Giant's Causeway colt, for $\$ 1,150,000$. O'Byrne also paid $\$ 450,000$ for a Malibu Moon filly. Trainer Todd Pletcher, in the company of Tabor and O'Byrne, bought two juveniles by Malibu Moon, as agent a filly for $\$ 950,000$ as the sale's second-highest price, and a colt for $\$ 550,000$.

Overall, Barretts reported that 60 horses sold for a gross of $\$ 10,665,000$ on Monday, an average of $\$ 177,750$ and a median of $\$ 112,500$.

## State Equine Statute Directory Published

Landowner liability-and the understanding of it-can be a critical factor in horse access to property. Liability is determined on a state-by-state basis and in most states is governed by two sets of laws: activity statutes and recreational use statutes.

In the past, this information has been hard to gather and difficult to interpret. The Equine Land Conservation Resource (ELCR) recognized a need to clarify the process and assembled an in-depth resource showing both sets of laws for each state. The "Directory of Equine Activity and Recreational Use Statutes" provides a single source to view and compare the statutes by state, and is available online. The ELCR and other organizations had gathered this information before, but as the laws changed, the documents quickly became outdated.

Because this site provides live links to the statutes themselves, the information will remain dynamic and up-to-date. In addition to the live links, the directory provides a small amount of analysis. Details are provided by state, including whether or not charging a nominal fee will impact a landowner's liability and whether specific language is required on signage. -continued at www.theHorse.com, By The Horse Staff

## Non-Member Registration Fees Increase

Registration fees for California-bred and Californiasired foals will increase as of April 1, 2014 for non-members of the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association (CTBA), it was announced on January 30.

Registration fees for non-members of the CTBA will be $\$ 200$ per foal if Bracidas essocilartlem
applied for by September 30 of yearling year and $\$ 250$ if applied for after September 30 of yearling year but before the following January 1.

Registration fees for member fees stay the same- $\$ 100$ per foal if applied for by September 30 of yearling year and $\$ 125$ if applied for after September 30 of yearling year but before the following January 1.

## Saddle Fit Can Be A Problem For Racehorses

Both sport and pleasure riders know how important saddle fit is to keeping their mounts healthy and comfortable. But what effects could considerably smaller and lighter racing saddles have on horses that are traveling considerably faster than the average reiner or jumper? Turns out these tiny pieces of tack can have a substantial impact.

In a recent study, researchers from the University of Zurich, in Switzerland, placed sensor pads under saddles worn by five racing-fit Thoroughbreds between two and six years old. Then, riders rode the horses at a canter and a gallop; the researchers collected pressure measurements at various places on the horses' backs and spines.-continued at www.BloodHorse.com, By Natalie Voss

Through the August 2014 issue of California Thoroughbred, the official publication of the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association (CTBA), this year's crop of Thoroughbreds foaled in the Golden State will again be spotlighted in each monthly magazine with advertorials featuring six to eight photos of foals per page.

The cost to publish individual photos is $\$ 75$ each, while a full page insertion will be discounted down to $\$ 500$. These charges represent a reduction of more than 50 per- cent on the price of a regular full-page advertisement in the magazine. Insertions will include a caption with each foal's sire, dam, broodmare sire, sex, date of birth and breeders, as well as the details, including a logo, of their farm location.

On March 8, 1997, Pacificbounty, a son of Pirate's Bounty, won the grade III, \$200,000 El Camino Real Derby for three-year-olds at Bay Meadows Racecourse, with Wild Wonder second and Carmen's Baby third in a field of six. Pacificbounty was trained by Walter Greenman and ridden by Kent Desormeaux. He ran the $11 / 16$ miles in 1:41 4/5 and won by one length at odds of 5-2. Pacificbounty was the second of four foals out of the Fast mare Fast Katie. The El Camino Real was Pacificbounty's third win in six starts. He also won the Golden Gate Derby and Forty Niner Handicap, placed in two other graded stakes and finished his career with five wins in 17 starts and earnings of $\$ 577,203$. Pacificbounty was bred by Ocean Air Stables, was foaled at Cardiff Stud Farm in Creston and was owned by Donald Grey, Thomas Harris, Wallace Schmidt, Gordon Sinkoff and Ben Bear.
