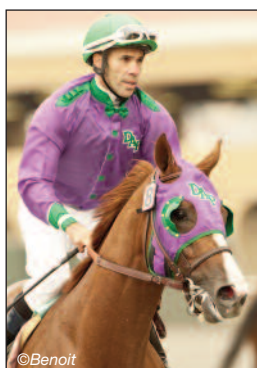


O'Neill Knows How Sherman Feels

Downs to prepare the colt for his victory in the Run for the Roses 59 years ago.

If the fates allow, Sherman, now 77, will make it back to Louisville, Kentucky, for the 140th classic, this year with California Chrome, like Swaps a California-bred chestnut.

Sherman is advised to enjoy the ride, from no less an authority than Doug O'Neill, who fulfilled every trainer's dream two years ago by winning the Derby with 15-1 long-shot I'll Have Another. After winning the Preakness, the upstart three-year-old came within hailing distance of going for the Triple Crown but was sidelined with an 11th-hour injury a day before the Belmont Stakes.

But first things first, and for streaking California Chrome, that would be Saturday's grade I, \$1 million Santa Anita Derby, a race O'Neill won the last two years, with Goldencents in 2013 and I'll Have Another in 2012.

O'Neill's bubble burst when he returned to the Kentucky Derby last year with Goldencents, who faded to 17th after prompting the pace in the 1 1/4-mile race. Lesson learned: the Derby is not a race to take for granted. Enjoy the ride.

O'Neill offered these words for Sherman: "Bring a good horse, which he has in California Chrome. The couple times we've been blessed to experience the Derby, it was about having a horse you have a lot of confidence in, and I know Art's got a lot of confidence in California

As for hitting the Derby trail? "He's going to have the time of his life."—*continued at www.brisnet.com, Bloodstock Journal story number 4*

third and fourth place finishers will each receive 40, 20 and 10 qualifying points respectively.

A chestnut colt by Harris Farms' Lucky Pulpit, California Chrome has become the talk of the racing world since going gate-to-wire in the grade II, 1 1/16-mile San Felipe Stakes on March 8, winning by 7 1/4 lengths under Victor Espinoza.

A winner of his last three races, all stakes, by a combined 19 lengths, California Chrome, with Espinoza up, worked a half mile at his Los Alamitos base on Saturday in :46.40 and galloped out six furlongs in 1:13.40.

"He looked sharp and he galloped out strong," said Sherman on Saturday. "All systems are go. His work was super, I was very impressed. I'll get him over there (Santa Anita), school him in the gate, go through the paddock and then we'll be ready to go...I know there's always a question until they've done it, but I really think this horse will go a mile and a quarter, no problem. He's doing everything right and we're looking forward to running him in the Santa Anita Derby."

California Chrome has five wins and a second from nine starts and has earnings of \$534,850. Bred in California by his owners, Steve Coburn and Perry Martin, he's out of a Maryland-bred mare named Love the Chase, who had one win—a maiden \$8,000 claiming triumph at Golden Gate Fields—from six starts and made \$7,020.

"When these guys first sent me the horse, they said 'Here's your Derby horse,'" said Sherman.—*continued at www.santaanita.com*

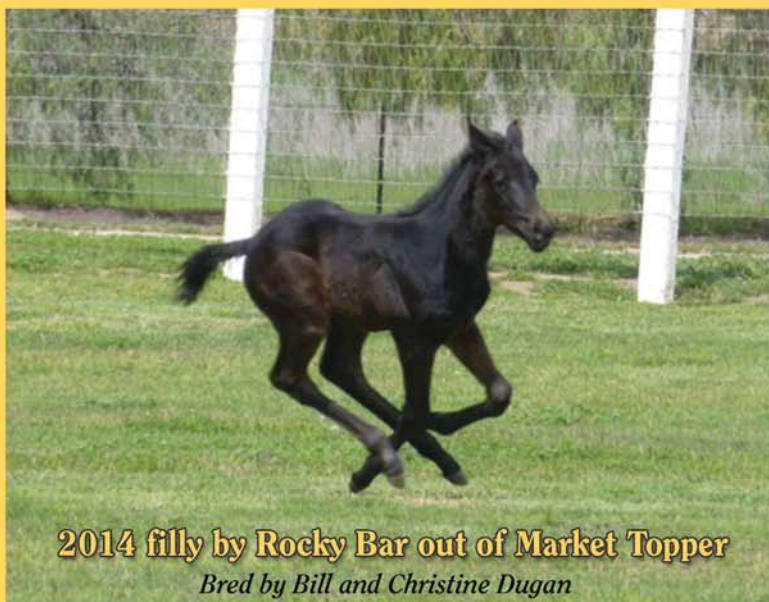

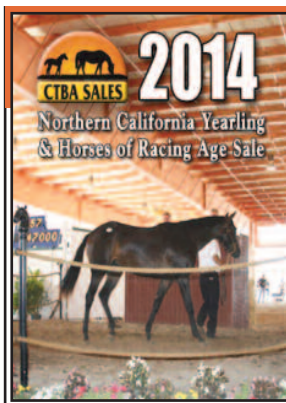

In 2004, as a freshman at Eureka High School in Eureka, California, Holly LaCount enrolled in a service learning program called Environmental and Spatial Technology (EAST) in which students develop projects to solve problems in their community. To honor her Grandma Joy, who died of ovarian cancer in 2003, she decided to develop a project that would help fund cancer research and support services. Spring Pasture Management Do's And Don'ts

After a long, cold winter in much of the United States, many farms and their fields will need some work come spring. The following guidelines will help ensure your pasture management efforts are both beneficial and economical for your farm.

Don't fertilize cool-season grass pastures heavily with nitrogen in the spring (more than 50-60 pounds actual nitrogen per acre would be considered heavy). 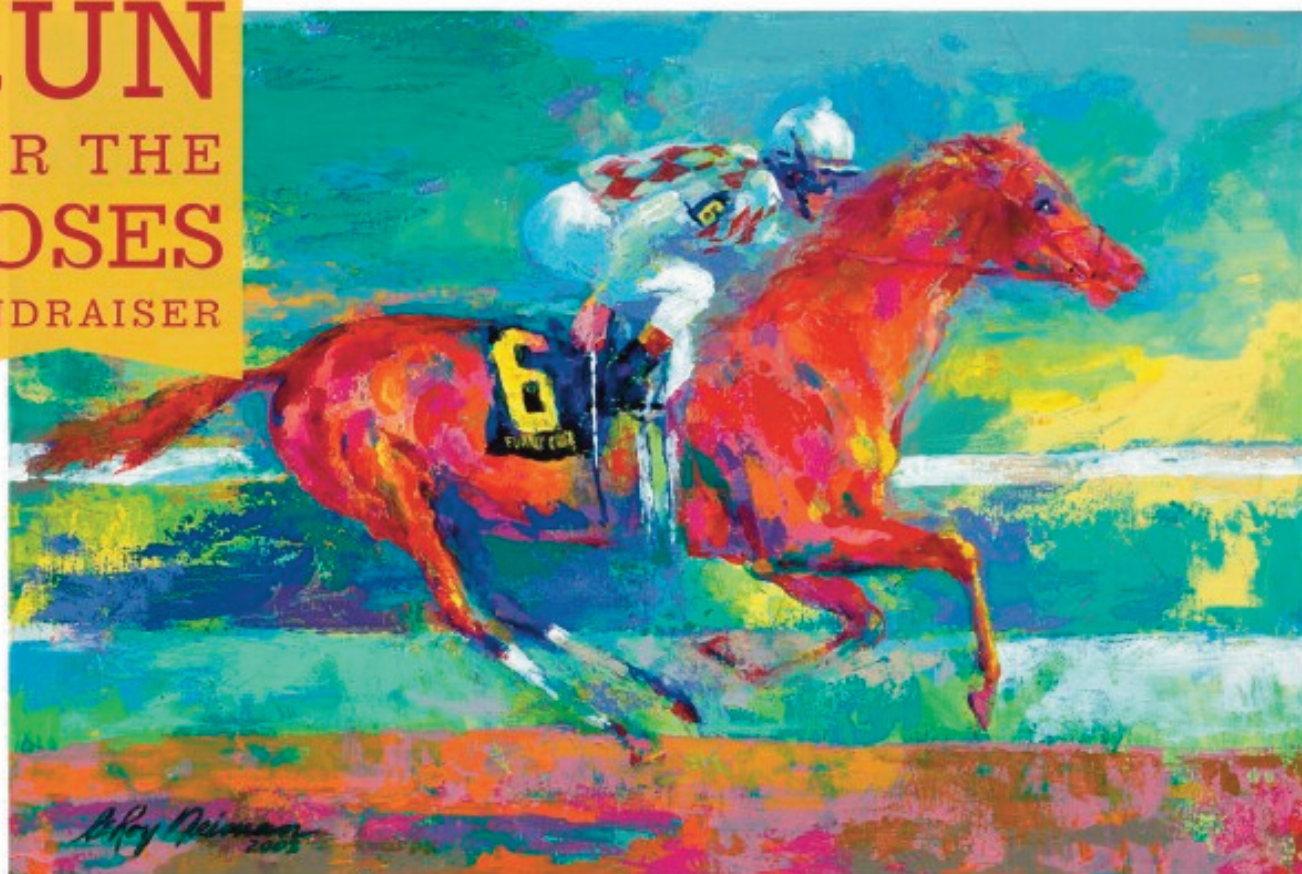

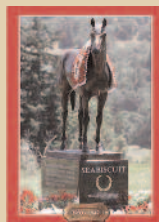

Your horse needs water when he travels, but some water sources could harbor infectious disease. Here's how to minimize your horse's risk of contracting disease via water sources.

Biosecurity Risk: Communal water troughs are an effective mechanism for transmission of disease agents, especially when both resident horses and those at the facility for events have access to the same water sources.

- **High Biosecurity Risk**—Using communal water troughs that available to all resident and event horses.
- **Medium Biosecurity Risk**—Using streams or large water sources available to event horses.
- **Minimal Biosecurity Risk**—Bringing and using individual water buckets for your own horses while at event grounds.
